Catastrophe Modeling Software – 21-02-0030-00

Topic

Citizens is requesting approval to contract with AIR Worldwide Corporation for Catastrophe Modeling Software. This software is used to estimate Citizens' exposure to hurricane losses, in order to ensure actuarial sound rating, improve risk management, enhance risk transfer decision-making, and assist in catastrophe reserving and real-time hurricane event response. Approval is requested for a five (5) year base term with a three (3) year renewal option, for an amount not to exceed \$4,849,039 for the life of the contract.

History

Citizens is seeking approval to contract with AIR Worldwide for Catastrophe Modeling Software through a cloud based, software as a service solution. Citizens uses this software to estimate Citizens' exposure to hurricane losses through AIR's proprietary modeling methodologies approved by the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology. These modeled hurricane loss results are needed for ratemaking and regulatory reporting, for making decisions as a storm is approaching, and for estimating losses immediately after a storm.

More technically, Citizens' Catastrophe Modeling Team uses the software to model full probabilistic loss distributions of annual aggregate and occurrence losses broken down in a variety of ways, including by total portfolio, policy, location, reinsurance layer, region, and event. It is used to prepare Citizens' annual aggregate and single occurrence modeled loss results, including return period loss, tail value at risk, and average annual loss, on both a monthly and quarterly basis. These modeled loss results are needed at building/location level as well as at the portfolio level.

The software also delivers real time event modeling. This includes mapping components that provide visual representations of Citizens' exposure, a hazard component that can retrieve detailed information for exposure data, and the ability to assess a location's exposure to a given tropical cyclone. It provides direct access to stochastic and historical event database tables which include event descriptions. Convenient access to exposure and loss databases for post processing and detailed queries are also provided.

Citizens' current catastrophe modeling software is provided by AIR Worldwide Corporation and is housed on Citizens' network. This contract expires on December 16, 2021.

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The requested contract was negotiated on best value to Citizens pursuant to Invitation to Negotiate No. 20-0030 for Catastrophe Modeling Software System. The ITN was issued on October 9, 2020. Citizens received responses from three (3) vendors: AIR Worldwide Corporation, Egecat, Inc (dba CoreLogic) and Risk Management Solutions, Inc. After review and scoring, the Evaluation Team recommended advancing all three (3) vendors to negotiations. Citizens' negotiation team recommended AIR Worldwide Corporation for award on April 13, 2021, after conducting negotiations with all three (3) vendors.

The contract is for a five (5) year base term with one (1), three (3) year renewal option. Approval is requested for an amount not to exceed \$4,849,039 including renewals.

Recommendation

Staff proposes that the Actuarial and Underwriting Committee review, and if approved recommend the Board of Governors:

- a) Authorize Citizens to contract with AIR Worldwide Corporation for an initial term of (5) years, and for a three (3) year optional renewal term, for an amount not to exceed \$4,849,039 for the life of the contract, as set forth in this Action Item; and
- b) Authorize staff to take any appropriate or necessary action consistent with this Action Item.
