## **Executive Summary**

### Claims Property Loss Estimating Software

#### **Topic**

This Consent Item seeks Board approval for \$4,225,000 in additional contract spend under Citizens' current contract with Xactware Solutions, Inc. for claims property loss estimating software, for a total of \$20,960,000 in approved contract spend. The software is critical to Citizens' daily and catastrophe operations for the accurate estimation of structure and contents damage, and repair and rebuilding costs for all submitted claims. Adjusters rely exclusively on the software to accurately document property damage and produce the necessary estimates to support Citizens' indemnity payments.

This Consent Item also requests approval to amend the contract to add XactXpert functionality at an additional cost, as part of the requested \$4,225,000. XactXpert will provide adjusters real-time feedback as to whether they are preparing a loss estimate consistent with Citizens Best Claims Practices and Estimating Guidelines.

#### **History**

Citizens entered into Contract No. 1514000600 with Xactware Solutions Inc. on March 1, 2015, pursuant to Invitation to Negotiate 14-0006. The contract includes a five (5) year base term with one (1) three-year renewal option and one (1) two-year renewal option. Citizens has exercised the last renewal option and the contract will expire on February 28, 2025.

The Board has previously approved a total of \$16,735,000 in spend over the course of this contract. \$13,000,000 was approved as part of the initial contract approval in 2015. Another \$2,175,000 was approved in 2017 for Geomni reports for automated measurement and sketching of roofs within Xactimate. An additional \$60,000 was also approved in 2017 for ClaimXperience functionality for policyholders to provide loss images or video to adjusters through a mobile application. Lastly, another \$1,500,000 was approved in 2020 for the development and addition of the ClaimXperience mobile app, which streamlined the estimate preparation process and enabled Citizens to put more guidance and controls around how an estimate is prepared and submitted.

This current request for additional spend is primarily due to unprecedented PIF growth and two major storm events, Hurricane Irma in 2017 and Hurricane Ian in 2022. For both storm events, Citizens had to request additional software licenses from Xactware due to the increase in adjuster resources that were deployed for these events.

At this time, Citizens would also like to request approval to amend the contract to add XactXpert. XactXpert is a claims rule management tool that presents real-time alerts to the adjuster based on Citizens Best Claims Practices and Estimating Guidelines. This will result in increased consistency and accuracy in estimate writing across all lines of business by helping the adjuster follow Citizens' guidelines, as well as many built-in industry standard rules.

This Consent Item seeks Board approval for \$4,225,000 in additional spend for a total approved spend of \$20,960,000 over the course of the contract term. This is comprised of an estimated \$3,100,000 for



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expenses arising from the need for additional Xactware licenses to support the Hurricane Irma and Ian efforts, and for the increased claims volume being processed through the software. It also includes an estimated \$1,125,000 for the XactXpert rules based management tool that will improve the consistency and accuracy of estimate results by providing adjusters with real-time alerts based on Citizens Best Claims Practices and Estimating Guidelines.

This request does not contemplate additional spend that may be required due to future storm activity. Additionally, any reduction in PIF count or Hurricane Ian adjuster resource requirements could reduce the anticipated spend.

#### Recommendation
