Enterprise Litigation Management System – Additional Spend for Continued System Operations

Topic

This Consent Item seeks Board approval for an additional \$1,000,000 in authorized spend under the Enterprise Litigation Management System "ELMS" contract with Trialnet, Inc. D/B/A Acuity Management Solutions, a Subsidiary of Mitratech Holdings, Inc. "Mitratech". If approved, this would increase the total spend authorized for Mitratech's ELMS services to \$2,950,000.

History

The Enterprise Litigation Management System is used by both Citizens' internal staff and contracted outside defense counsel to facilitate the management of all activity on claims related legal matters, including: data analysis and reporting, management and auditing of all law firm and litigation vendor billing, storage of all litigation related documents and communication between Citizens and its contracted outside defense counsel. Citizens is currently in a transition period with Mitratech supporting the existing ELMS system, named "Acuity", while staff works with Litify, Inc. to implement the new ELMS solution procured under ITN 22-0019.

The current contract for ELMS, with Mitratech Holdings, Inc. ("Mitratech"), dates to April 30, 2012, following the completion of ITN 11-0054. This resulted in a contract with Acuity Management Solutions ("Acuity"). On September 29, 2020, Acuity was acquired by Mitratech, who continued the Software-as-a-Service ("SaaS") solution, now called "Acuity ELM Essentials."

Mitratech is currently providing these ELMS services, after choosing not to participate in ITN 22-0019. That procurement resulted in a contract award to Litify, Inc. (Litify) for a new ELMS system. Thereafter, Single Source 22-2003 procured Mitratech to contractually provide the required services, both to maintain the current operating system, and to assist with the successful transition to the new vendor, Litify, Inc. This contract with Mitratech is set to expire on June 18, 2025, with no renewal available. The remaining time before contract expiration should allow for the successful transition to Litify.

The original estimated contract amount for Mitratech's ELMS services was \$1,950,000 for a recommended three (3) year contract period and included all anticipated costs associated with ongoing maintenance/license fees throughout the contract term. This estimate was based on certain assumptions pertaining to data/file size and litigation spend known at the time.

However, since the latest Mitratech contract was approved by the Board on May 18, 2022, there have been several factors that have contributed to an increase of expenses for the use of the Acuity ELMS system requiring additional spend, which include the following:

 Increase in litigation volume. During the eighteen (18) month period from January 2021 through August 2022, Citizens experienced a 50% increase in its pending lawsuit count, from 13,000 to over 20,000 suits. The fees for the Acuity ELMS system are calculated based on a percentage



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of the total dollar amount of invoices processed through the system each month. With this sharp increase in pending litigation came an increase in associated litigation costs, which directly impacted the costs for the ongoing Acuity ELMS system. As an example, in May 2022, at the time the original spend request was submitted to the Board, Citizens paid \$6.7 million through the ELMS system. By May of 2023, that number had risen to almost \$13 million. This increase in invoice amounts/litigation costs effectively doubled the per month cost of the Acuity ELMS system over that period.

- 2. Increase in hourly rates for contracted outside counsel. New Claims Legal Services contracts for outside defense counsel went into effect in February 2022 and provided increased hourly rates for Citizens' panel counsel for all new matters assigned after the effective date. This increase in hourly rates resulted in an increase in litigation related costs. Similar to the impacts of the rise in litigation volume, these inflationary increases directly impacted the cost for the Acuity ELMS, given that it is calculated based on the amount of invoice processed through the system each month. In May 2022 when the original Mitratech ELMS action item was approved by the Board, only 20% of matters were under the new higher rates. Currently, over 75% of matters are under the new rates.
- 3. <u>Transition assistance</u>. Mitratech continues to assist in the transition over to the new ELMS vendor/system with Litify, Inc. Citizens' contractual agreement with Mitratech provides for transition assistance to be provided by Mitratech at mutually agreed upon rate. In November 2023, Citizens entered into a Scope of Work agreement with Mitratech to provide these transition assistance services using a mix of fixed and hourly costs. Mitratech has been a critical and valuable partner given the complexity of the ELMS transition project.

Staff currently anticipates the "go-live" date, when Citizens will be fully transitioned over to the new ELMS vendor, Litify, Inc., to occur during the month of October 2024. To date, Citizens has incurred approximately \$1.6 million in spend under the ongoing ELMS agreement with Mitratech. The remaining authorized spend under this agreement of approximately \$350,000 will be exhausted prior to the anticipated go-live date. Therefore, given the (1) increased costs of using Acuity set forth above, (2) criticality of the ELMS system in Citizens' Claims Litigation operations, and (3) the time and process required to fully transition to the new Litify ELMS system, the attached Consent Item seeks Board approval for an additional \$1,000,000 in spend under the Mitratech ELMS agreement.

Recommendation
